Scripture passage: Hebrews 12:25-29

Context questions

- 1) What made a sacrifice acceptable according to the Old Testament Law? Could just anything be offered to God on His altar?
 - a. Read Leviticus 10:1-3. What does this teach us about the importance of offering an acceptable sacrifice—why is it important? What happened when someone didn't?

Focus on passage

- 2) Do you see the sacrifice language/image in this passage? How does it draw on the same image of an Old Testament sacrifice?
- 3) Based on this passage what makes something an acceptable sacrifice? (consider the type of sacrifice and the manner in which it's offered)
 - a. Why should a sacrifice be offered with reverence and awe?

Application

- 4) How does it give the Christian hope to know that there is something new that is coming?
- 5) What are things that Christians can think are acceptable sacrifices but are actually things that will be shaken (won't last)?
 - a. What are examples of things that will last and how can we know the difference?
- 6) How does this passage help us know what the important things are to focus on as a church?
 - a. What are examples of those important things – both within the church and outside the church?
- 7) How does this passage help you know what to focus on?
